The Fort Lauderdale Sunshine Chordsmen

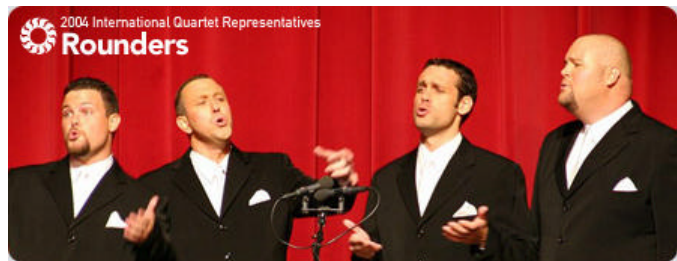

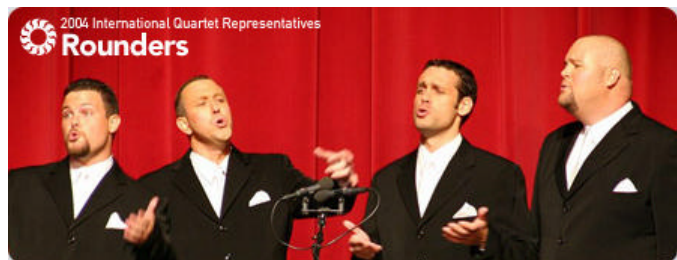
